Both churches are limited in number of spaces due to social distancing. The church at Holy Ghost has thirteen pews plus two rows of chairs, so has a minimum number of 15 people. St Michael's has 20 spaces available. You are advised to book a place in advance: you can do this by email to yeovil.holyghost@cliftondiocese.com or by phone/text to the Parish Office on 07856-989013 during office hours of Monday, Wednesday or Friday 10am to 12 midday.

REOPENING OUR CHURCHES: *Father Jean-Patrice writes:* We have now reopened our churches from Tuesday 14 July with a small number of parishioners attending. Hopefully, more will do so as word spreads around of the new provisional times and arrangements, and that every effort is being made to make the environment as safe as possible. We are still in need of volunteers to help with stewarding and cleaning. There are documents which are available on request, but it may suffice to say that the touching of surfaces should be minimised as much as possible, and should be cleaned immediately after use. Also that the movement of parishioners should be regulated so that they are kept at a safe distance from each other (excepting of course those who live in the same household). Also, at least one steward should have basic safeguarding training: they do not need to have a DBS, but they should do a simple online EduCare course (see separate article by Margaret Gulliver).

I am celebrating Mass at Somerton, as Father Peter Clarke has not been permitted at this time to go to the church. Since I am also acting as Steward for some Masses, we have a provisional schedule of Masses, at least for the month of August. **Please note that there is an extra Mass at Holy Ghost on Wednesday at 10am.** The provisional schedule is therefore as follows:

The Bishops have said that the Obligation to go to Mass on Sunday remains suspended. This has to be the case, as most churches cannot contain all the parishioners who normally go on Sunday. An example is Westminster Cathedral, which with the measures put in for social distancing, can only hold sixty people. Therefore the bishops are encouraging us to go to Mass at alternative times during the week. They also recognise, that for various reasons, some parishioners cannot go to Mass at this time. So they are encouraging parishes to continue with livestreaming and recording of Masses. The Sunday morning Mass will be recorded, and will be made available on the website later in the day. As mentioned before, we have received two generous donations from parishioners to buy a camera that will allow us to livestream Masses and other services: we are waiting to take part in a Diocesan scheme that should hopefully reduce the monthly cost incurred.

Therefore, although you can still turn up to go to Mass, **it is recommended that you book a place in order to ensure you have a seat.** At Holy Ghost, the pews have been rearranged so that thirteen pews are available, plus two clusters of three chairs. So a

minimum of fifteen people can be accommodated at Mass. However, if people live in the same household (or bubble), they could share a pew with up to six people. So the maximum number of people is eighty-four (the capacity of St Michael's is 20 individuals, or 20 households/bubbles). We are keeping a distance of two metres (rather than 1 metre plus), so face masks will not be mandatory. The Bishops have said the following notice regarding face coverings:

Face coverings are currently mandatory on public transport and will be mandatory in shops and in supermarkets from 24th July 2020. People are also strongly encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a church.

And also:

Worshippers should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.

However, it is required to use hand sanitiser on entering and leaving the building. **It is also essential to not come to church if you are showing any symptoms, such as coughing.**

How to book

This will be done through our Parish Administrator Sue Chant, who is now able to work again after having been on furlough. Please indicate which Mass you want to go to (starting from Tuesday 14 July at 7pm), and if you are part of a household/bubble so that you can share a pew. You can do this by sending her an email at the parish address: yeovil.holyghost@cliftondiocese.com, or by calling her on the parish mobile phone on **07856-989013**, where you may also leave a text. Sue will be working from home, and will not be available on the parish landline. Telephone booking will only be available during her working hours of Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 10am and 12pm midday.

Please note:

At this point in time, it is not compulsory to book, but if you turn up to Mass and you have not booked and the church is full, you will be asked by the steward to wait outside. **You are not permitted to enter the church if it is full, due to the social distancing guidelines.** These guidelines are for the safety of everyone and must be complied with.

PLEASE PRAY FOR: Father Martin Griffin MSFS who was Parish Priest here between 2009 to 2013. Father Martin had stomach pains during the lockdown, but it was obviously difficult for him to see a doctor. Once he could, the doctor referred him to the hospital, where he was diagnosed with cancer of the colon. Father Martin saw a consultant on Wednesday, and was told that no further treatment is possible. He left the parish of Royal Wootton Bassett where he had been serving since February on Friday, and is now resident at Nazareth House Nursing Home. CAFOD JOINS DEC CORONAVIRUS APPEAL TO SAVE LIVES AS COVID-19 SPREADS IN REFUGEE CAMPS AND CONFLICT AREAS:

CAFOD has joined forces with the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) to help millions of vulnerable people whose lives are at risk as the coronavirus pandemic spreads across refugee camps and countries suffering conflict.

Families who have been forced to flee their homes in places including Syria, South Sudan, and the Democratic Republic of Congo, now face another deadly threat as coronavirus takes hold in new areas.

CAFOD Director, Christine Allen, said:

"In the UK our struggle against coronavirus has entered the next phase, but in many of the world's poorest communities, the fight has only just begun. Families who have fled conflict, and are living in crowded camps or makeshift shelters, are especially vulnerable.

"We need your support to reach these communities and help people to cope as best they can when an outbreak of the virus strikes.

"In many places around the world, there are not enough hospital beds or supplies to treat everyone who falls ill. But promoting handwashing and providing personal protective equipment, health advice and food parcels can make a huge difference."

The first coronavirus case has been confirmed in north-west Syria, causing alarm for a region where camps are over-crowded, and hospitals in ruins, after nearly ten years of war.

"It is critical that we act now to reach millions of vulnerable people who have lost everything and no longer have ways of coping," said Allen. "Working with the Disasters Emergency Committee will allow us to scale up our response and reach more people in need."

Donations to the DEC's Coronavirus Appeal will support vulnerable families by:

- Providing handwashing facilities, clean water, soap, and hand sanitiser
- Promoting public information messages on ways people can stay safe and protect others
- Supporting health systems and aid workers by providing training, personal protective equipment, and medical supplies for frontline responders.

CAFOD is already responding to the coronavirus crisis in some of the poorest countries in the world. Since launching its emergency appeal on 30 April, it has scaled up its support to local aid workers who are providing food and improving hand-washing and sanitation facilities in countries across Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East.

It is also supporting the training of faith leaders in hygiene promotion and working with churches to use their networks to share clear and accurate information on how communities can protect themselves from coronavirus. This includes messages on Catholic radio stations and producing posters in local dialects.



Dear friends and fellow parishioners,

Following on from my message in last week's bulletin, there is some further information which I need to share with you. This relates to the joyful news that our churches may start very slowly to open once more for Mass (in small numbers)

As always, there are many things to put in place, and to take into consideration, before this may safely happen; some relating to Safeguarding.



Clifton Diocese Safeguarding Team have circulated advice which we need to adhere to. They outline their reasons for this as follows:

What is Safeguarding?

Every human being has a value and dignity which the Catholic faith acknowledges as coming directly from God's creation of male and female in his own image and likeness. This implies a duty to value all people and therefore to support them and protect them from harm. This is done by implementing legislation through policies and procedures.

In the Catholic Church this is demonstrated by the provision of carefully planned activities for children, young people and adults; supporting families under stress, caring for those hurt by abuse in the past, ministering to those who have caused harm.

It is because of these varied ministries that we need to provide a safe environment for all which promotes and supports their wellbeing. This will include carefully selecting and appointing those who work with children, young people or adults at risk of harm and responding robustly where concerns arise.

Therefore, all clergy, employees and volunteers working with vulnerable groups, including children, must adhere to the Catholic Church's national safeguarding policies, all of which can be found on www.csas.uk.net

Why does this affect opening our churches for public worship?

Sadly, for some people, the pressure they have found themselves and their families under has been very hard to bear. During lockdown, organisations and charities have reported an increase in domestic abuse, child abuse, elderly abuse, neglect, mental health, and substance misuse. For some people, walking back into a church building after a long period of time might be the first opportunity they have to share their experience and speak about how they are feeling. Some may disclose incidents that need a Safeguarding response. This is intended to help you if you are faced with such a situation.

Therefore, while we are being asked to volunteer as stewards for guiding and helping people who wish to attend Mass, as well as thoroughly cleaning the church before and after Mass, Clifton is stating the following for volunteers:

There is no requirement to have DBS clearance.

They must be a current volunteer within the church and known to the Parish Priest

Where possible at least one of every pair of Stewards should have some Safeguarding training. It is beneficial if both have. A module on EduCare will suffice. (Teachers and some health workers are likely to have received Safeguarding training within their professional role).

Matt Callaghan, YCST Operations Manager writes: 'Since the 16th March 2020, The Lord's Larder has seen an unprecedented rise in demand, tripling overnight. We currently help 380 people each week, that compares with the 407 people we helped for the whole of February. We would appreciate any support you can give the food bank at this time, either with items of food or by financial donation.

Food Donations: as of today's date (Wednesday 1st April 2020) food donations are still being collected; Morrisons in Yeovil are dedicating their currently closed café to support this. Food donations can also be placed in Yeovil's main Tesco, Asda, Lord's Larder Collection Trolleys or in Waitrose Crewkerne Collection Basket. You can also still place donations in The Lord's Larder Basket located in the reception area of The Gateway Building, Postcode - BA20 1QN - (located behind the AKS Renault building next to Ninesprings Country Park) - between 10am and 2pm Monday - Friday. If you need help carrying your donations from the car, please deliver in the morning when we have our willing volunteers ready to help or phone ahead to arrange assistance for an afternoon delivery.
